Industrial and Systems Engineering Department Graduate Student Awards

The Industrial and Systems Engineering department faculty is pleased to announce the creation of up to three new awards to be awarded annually to graduate students in recognition of outstanding teaching and research accomplishments. The department will accept applications only from currently enrolled graduate students in the ISE department. Students can apply for a research award, a teaching award, or both, but must submit separate applications for research and teaching awards if applying for both. A student can win each type of award at most once while a graduate student at the University of Florida.

Winners will receive a \$1,000 unrestricted award and special recognition on a plaque in the main office of the ISE department. At most two research awards and at most one teaching award will be given each year, depending on the quality of the applications. All applications will be reviewed by the graduate committee and the department scholarship coordinator and awards will be approved by the ISE department chair. Awards will be presented at the IIE/APM spring banquet in April. Further details regarding the award criteria and application procedures are provided below for each type of award.

Research Awards

- Applications should consist of a brief (1-2 page) summary of research accomplishments while a graduate student at UF, along with a statement of the student's role in writing each of the papers mentioned. Applicants are encouraged to include copies of co-authored papers as supporting material.
- Special emphasis will be placed on high quality journal acceptances, high quality journal submissions, conference proceedings, and invited presentations (in that order).

Teaching Awards

- Applications should consist of a brief (1-2 page) summary of teaching accomplishments while a graduate student at UF, along with a statement of the student's teaching philosophy and future teaching goals. The application should also include copies of all past teaching evaluations for courses taught at UF.
- This award will be open solely to graduate students that have served as course instructors, and not strictly as teaching assistants.
